- 4) APPROVAL OF MINUTES from Monday, September 8, 2025

5) TREASURER'S REPORT:

This month's bill includes the accountant charges and BCCLS Bill.

1/3 mil numbers are now available.

6) DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Housekeeping

- Borough Check Received: The library received the fourth quarter installment for 2025
- 1/3 mill: The NJ State Library has published the 1/3 mil numbers for 2026.
- **Baker and Tylor Shutdown**: The company was founded in 1828 and has ceased operations. For many months now, there were delays in the delivery of books and many backordered books had to be purchased from Amazon.

Haworth Library has an Amazon Business Prime account. Prime for Libraries is offering books at a discounted price, 40% – 45% off the MSRP.

Other options for wholesalers that sell to the libraries are Brodart and Ingram. They are also experiencing delays due to the volume. Barnes and Noble offers institutional membership and a discount of 20%.

- **Staff computers upgraded**: Three staff computers were upgraded by BCCLS. Assistance from J&B Lock was requested to install and configure the software for cameras on these later.
- Building Maintenance: DPW was requested to replace the burnt out bulbs in the library. Thomas Runge
 also scheduled a visit from the pest control company to spray for the bees in the children's room and
 other critters in the community room. The timer for the lights at the library entrance was replaced by
 Pesh-E-Lectric.

- Fire Truck Visit: Thomas Runge also helped in hosting a Fire Truck visit for our little patrons.
- **Haworth Library Art Exhibition:** The exhibition titled, The Pure Landscape Show is on display at Haworth Library till December 1th, 2025. It showcases work by 20 artists and focuses exclusively on natural landscapes, without significant human or man-made elements. A reception was held on Saturday, October 4, 2025 and was very well attended.
- **Exhibition Donation**: A donation was made by the artist who sold four pieces showcased during the photography show in July and August, 2025.
- Bergen Center for Child Development: Once again the library will provide an opportunity for a student to do an unpaid internship once a week for 1 hour for the upcoming school year. Haworth Library has collaborated with the school for some years now. The library will also host five classes for a visit in the month of October 2025 and May 2026.
- **Library Display**: The adult collection highlights 'Read and Weep' books. The children's area showcases seasonal books on Fall and Halloween.
- QuickBooks Online Subscription: The subscription was renewed till September 22nd, 2026.

• **Haworth Day**: The Friends of the Library, Regina Eftychiou, Allison Hammer, and I represented the library on Saturday, September 27th. The friends solicited donations by selling bird houses painted and donated by Regina Eftychiou. They also raised over \$500 through book dedications of children's books.

Some of the painted dogs, cats and butterflies were on display and bids for the silent auction could be placed. Upcoming Family Scarecrow Event was also promoted.

- Haworth Paws and Wings: The Friends of Haworth Library fundraiser auction, scheduled for Thursday,
 October 9th at 7:30 pm was attended by 55 library patrons. Food and beverages were servedAll the
 beautiful creations found a good home. One of the dogs was donated to the library after the auction.
 Many thanks to everyone who came to support the library.
- **BCCLS Friends Brunch:** Beth Potter, Terry Gala and I will attend the BCCLS brunch on Tuesday, October 21st at the Fiesta in Wood Ridge. The event celebrates the Friends Groups and supports the BCCLS Scholarship Fund. The Friends of Haworth Library will contribute a Jane Austen basket for the silent auction.
- Upcoming Programs Sponsored by the Friends:
 - Family Scarecrow Event: This yearly event is sponsored by the Friends who charge \$20 per scarecrow to offset the cost of hay and pumpkins. The Friends also sponsor a live musician for the event. Many thanks to DPW who assist by installing frames for the scarecrows outside Haworth Borough Hall.
 - Author Visit: Haworth native and best seller Lauren Grodstein will visit Haworth Library to discuss her new book, A Dog in Georgia (Grodstein, 2025) on Saturday, November 15th, at 1 pm. The event cost will be shared by the Friends and the Library.
 - o Jane Austen Week: 250th Anniversary of Jane Austen's birth will be celebrated with a reading of Pride and Prejudice in the first week of December. Other programs are being organized by Beth Potter including a zoom call with an author who has written books on Jane Austen. The library will also show one of the movies based on her novels.
 - Gay Willis and Friends Holiday Concert: The Holiday concert featuring Gay Willis is scheduled for Sunday, December 7th at 3 pm.
